The benefits of Drama are endless:

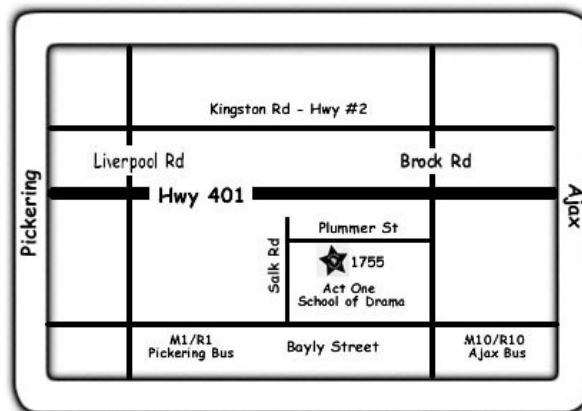

Performance Class (Class Size: Min 6 / Max 10) The focus is on giving more advanced students the opportunity to challenge themselves and practice skills learned through more formal classes, in a full and intensive rehearsal and performance environment. Voice Over & Radio Theatre (Class Size: Min 5 / Max 8) Students will learn the basics of voice work including improved breathing, vocal warm ups, widening vocal range and techniques for tackling accents and creating "characters" in an audience's ear. They will learn about the radio industry and how to create sound effects (Foley) using household items. Registration and Class Information

-  Fee payment by cheque or cash only.
-  A minimum of one session (4 weeks) tuition must be paid at registration.
-  Post-dated cheques for course balance must accompany registration. A \$10 charge will apply to each and all NSF cheques.
-  Refunds will only be given for classes remaining after the date of the school receiving written course withdrawal notice.
-  In the event of class cancellations due to bad weather, etc, a voice message will be left on the school's answering service.
-  Maximum 10:1 student to staff ratio in every class. When a class exceeds 10 students a Teaching Assistant is automatically assigned to help the class.
-  Late Starts are permitted. Deadlines vary for each class. Please contact the school. Late start credits against course fees are applied.
-  Full year students will have at least 3 performance opportunities. Winter option students will perform in year-end productions only.

Available Course Fee Discounts

-  Students who pay the full year course fee in advance receive a 15% discount.
-  Students who pay in two 18-week term installments receive a 10% discount.
-  Students registering for multiple classes receive a 10% discount off all classes after the first one.
-  Families registering more than one child for any course receive a 10% discount off all courses taken by all children after the first one.
-  Students who attended at least one week of Act One's 2011 Theatre Summer Camp receive a 5% discount off each course registration.
-  New students referred to the school by an existing student receive a 5% discount off each course registration.
-  Existing students who refer a new student to the school will receive a 5% discount off one course for each referral.
-  Students who attended at least 18 weeks of classes during the 2010-11 year receive a 5% discount off each course registration.
